## II. MANIFESTATIONS OF CHRIST'S POWER IN PUBLIC MINISTRY John 11

## A. HOW JESUS RESPONDED TO HIS DISCIPLES CONCERNING LAZARUS' DEATH (1:1-16)

	1.	When Jesus heard the message that Lazarus was sick He said it was that He and His Father might be (1-4).
	2.	After having heard, and even though Jesus loved Lazarus and his two sisters, He abode still more days. Here we notice once again that everything Jesus did was in obedience to the Father's will and in keeping with a divine timetable (5,6).
	3.	Then Jesus proposed to His disciples that they might go to But they questioned this course based on how the Jews had sought to stone Him when He had healed the blind man (7,8).
	4.	Jesus answered their fears by using a parable of a man walking during the daytime (9,10). As long as a man walked during the twelve hours of light he didn't need to worry about stumbling or accidental death. This meant there was no danger of His being killed as He walked in harmony with the Father's will.
	5.	Jesus then told His disciples that Lazarus was sleeping and that He would go and awaken him. Jesus was referring to Lazarus' but His disciples thought He meant natural sleep (11-14).
	6.	Jesus told His disciple He was glad He had not been there at Bethany for their sakes that they might believe. Someone has said there is no record where anyone even died in the presence of Jesus. The Lord Jesus wanted their to be strengthened and the miracle He would perform would do just that (15).
	7.	Thomas no doubt reasoned if Jesus went to Judea He would be killed. And if His disciples went with Him they also would be killed (16). His words were probably not words of optimism but they expressed personal loyalty and courage. He was willing to die alongside the Saviour.

	4.	When Jesus asked Martha if she believed what He said, she affirmed her faith in Him and and went and called her sister (27,28).
	5.	When Mary went out to meet Jesus some of the Jews thought she was going to the grave of Lazarus and they followed her (29-31).
	6.	Mary said the same thing to Jesus that Martha had said. When Jesus saw her weeping along with the others He asked where Lazarus was laid, and began to weep also (32-35).
	7.	When Jesus commanded the stone to be taken away, Mary replied that Lazarus had been dead four days and would be stinking by then. Jesus' response to Mary was to bring her also to a deeper in Him (36-40).

## **EXPOSITORY NOTES**

11:11-13	Notice the Lord Jesus compared death for a believer to sleep (Acts 7:60);
	I Cor. 15:51; I Thess. 4:13-18)

It was a day's journey from Bethabara where Jesus was to Bethany. Lazarus must have died right after the messengers left to find Jesus. Then after Jesus had heard He remained in Bethabara for two more days. Then He departed to Bethany which took another day. This explains the four days that Lazarus was in the

grave.

Notice the raising of Lazarus from the dead was a resuscitation and cannot be classified as a resurrection because Lazarus was returned to his former state before his illness. In this process, his state of decay was reversed and his body was revitalized but he did not receive immortality which means "alive to die no more." Lazarus later died again.
