1 THESSALONIANS 5:1-11

VI. PAUL'S ENCOURAGEMENTS TO THE THESSALOWIANS CONTINUED.

- B. Was some reassurance concerning the Day of the Lord
 - (5:1-11)
 - 1. He reminded them of how it would come about(1-3)
 - a. He didn't need to write unto them concerning when it would happen this is something they already knew. It would come as a thief in the night. In other words when people are asleep and not expecting anyone.
 - b. The Day of the Lord would come when the world proclaims peace and safety and it would_mean sudden destruction (3). This correlates with Dan. 9:27 and II Thess. 2:3,4 when Antichrist will confirm a covenant of peace.
 - 2. He pointed out why that day wouldn't overtake them(4-5)
 - a. The Thessalonian believers were not in darkness. In other words they had spiritual understanding and could see what would lead up to this day (4).
 - b. The Thessalonians were children or sons of light. They were not children of darkness - living in sin and characterized by the blindness of sin. They were characterized by discernment and an ability to see (5). Note Eph. 4:17-19;5:8).
 - c. The reason the Day of the Lord will overtake the world is because they have no light or discernment about spiritual things.
 - 3. He told them what to do until that day came (6-8)
 - a. They were not to sleep as others do but be sober-minded and watch (6). The world is asleep when it comes to the Day of the Lord. It is not watching for Him.
 - b. The people that sleep and sin are doing it in the night or in the darkness-that is because they can't see (7).
 - c. But those that are of the day, who can see spiritually, should be sober or alert. They should also put on the breastplate of faith and love and a

helmet of the hope of salvation (8). Note these are pieces of armament to protect them while they await that day.

- 4. He showed them why they wouldn't suffer the wrath of that Day (9-11).
 - a. They were not "appointed" to wrath but to obtain salvation in Christ (9).
 - b. Notice whether believers are awake or sleep they are appointed to live together with Him (10).
 - c. This was something they could comfort and edify one another with (11).
